In my opinion, the study of environmental and climatic changes is one of the most important topics that can be worked on at the present time, especially in the Mediterranean field, which It is the focus of the most important population centers in the world, and the accompanying changes and various environmental phenomena, as these environmental changes constitute the most important obstacles that prevent the achievement of sustainable development and progress.

Among the phenomena that concern me and the world's attention as well, are the climatic changes that the world is currently experiencing, such as drought and urban expansion at the expense of vital areas...etc."

"Through this multidisciplinary master, there are hopes to open up the field and job opportunities for graduates in order to search for appropriate solutions to limit the aggravation of these environmental changes.

We have interviewed also Maissa Chouchane who is an Algerian girl of 24 years old that specialised in Environmental Urbanism and currently is graduated on the master Mehmed and also teaches History and Geography in middle school.



Regarding the importance of training in relation to environmental and climate change in the Mediterranean she agrees that it is a very relevant and wealthy area which is a major factor to maintain the ecological process in the world. As per what worries her most, she says desertification and drought are the most significant topics to worry about and it opens up new future opportunities for trained people.

When asked about the positive aspects of the master she said: "In my opinion the most positive aspect of this master is that it allowed me to link my speciality as an urbanist to the environment. I would recommend the Master to other students, because this type of masters about the Mediterranean is very rare."



At the end of our talk we asked her about her plans for the future after the master and what she would like to work on and she told us she is currently working as a teacher to pass the awareness of environmental and climate change in the Mediterranean, and in the meanwhile she's working on projects and maps about land-use and land-cover change in some areas in Algeria.
